

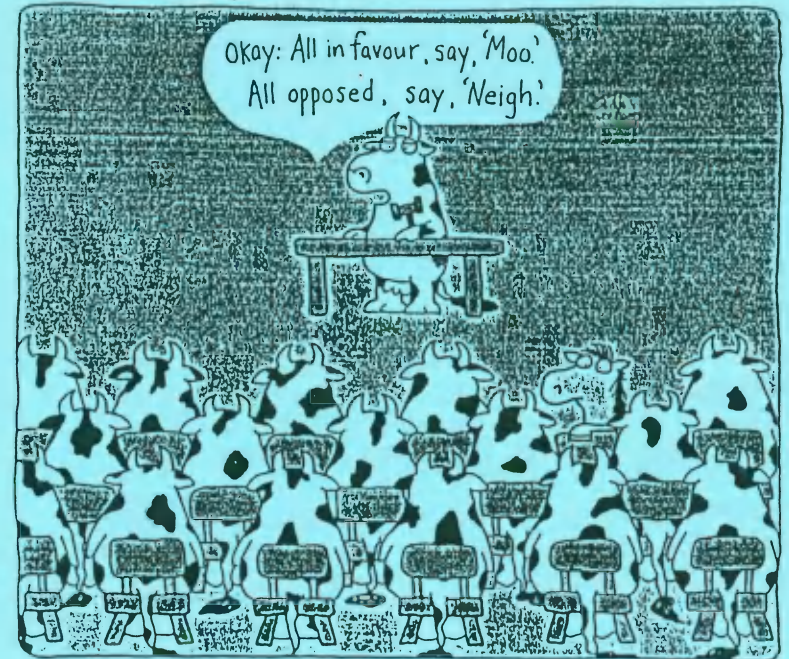

The overall aim of NETWORK WAITANGI is to provide a network for groups and individuals who are working for a society based on the Treaty of Waitangi and who are actively supporting Tino Rangatiratanga.

Focussed on Pakeha responsibility the NETWORK is open to all tangata whenua, people from Pacific Island nations and other tauiwi who share this aim.

Membership of the national NETWORK is open to groups and associate membership is open to individuals (this provision was made for those who are geographically isolated from a group committed to a Treaty based society), provided that they acknowledge and promote the objects of NETWORK WAITANGI INC. These groups and individuals are admitted at an Annual General Meeting of the national NETWORK.

NETWORK WAITANGI OTAUTAHU (NWO) is a founding member of the national NETWORK. If you would like to be associated with NWO just phone 655266 or write to the NWO office at Trustbank Community House, 187 Cashel Street, Otautahi (Christchurch).

The NETWORK WAITANGI OTAUTAHU Organising Group encourages active involvement in the NETWORK and takes seriously the need for initiation of the following tasks:

- * ensuring a commitment to accountability to each other and to mana whenua
- * organising meetings of those who declare their interest in NETWORK WAITANGI OTAUTAHU
- * running introductory Treaty awareness workshops, paying particular attention to follow up
- * supporting those who wish to learn to lead workshops
- * working towards developing continuing education opportunities, following on from the introductory workshops * employing an Evaluation and Research Worker (Dean van Mierlo).
- * actively keeping information flowing between groups and individuals both locally and nationally.
- * organising meetings on topics of interest
- * undertaking any other activities consistent with the above aim and objectives.
